

Pre-Arrival Checklist

Ensure you have submitted the appropriate documents for admission. Reach out to Undergraduate Admissions or the Graduate College for more information.	Prepare for your <u>visa appointment</u> by gathering your documents, completing the <u>DS-160 Nonimmigrant Visa Application</u> and preparing for the interview. Check the website for the <u>U.S. Consulate/Embassy</u> where you will be interviewed and given further requirements/instructions.
Undergraduate and graduate students should check their application portal to track and accept their admission. Once admitted, you will receive your Form I-20 electronically	Complete online orientation through <u>ISS</u> <u>website</u> . This online orientation is required for all new F-1 undergraduate, graduate and exchange international students.
Set up and access your <u>O-key</u> <u>account</u> and OSU email. All official communication from OSU will be sent to this account.	Undergraduate students must pay their enrollment deposit and register for International Student Orientation in their portal.
Pay <u>SEVIS I-901</u> fee online, once you receive your Form I-20.	Secure your <u>housing</u> . Please note, all freshmen are required to live on-campus. Review <u>immunization requirements</u> .
Contact your corresponding U.S. embassy or consulate and schedule your <u>visa interview</u> . List of all <u>U.S.</u> <u>embassies</u> . Check visa appointment wait times on the	You can enter the U.S. up to 30 days before classes start. At the port of entry, present your passport, F-1 visa, Form I-20 and your admission letter.
